

STUDY NOTES

- What books, TV shows or movies have you read or seen that are set in an American college? How does Sarah's experience in Freshman Year compare?
 - From what you know, how is an American college experience similar or different to an Australian university?
- Freshman Year is a graphic novel. How did this format affect your reading experience and enjoyment of the book? How might it have been different if Freshman Year was presented as just prose, without the illustrations?
- Do you think Sarah handles her relationship, and then breakup, with Ben well? Why or why not? What advice would you give to a friend in a similar situation to Sarah?
- How is the theme of friendship explored in *Freshman Year*? In what ways do Sarah's friends support her, and how are her friendships with Finn and Emma back home different to those at college?
- Sarah struggles with facing uncertainty and change. What are some coping strategies she tries, and what are some other possibilities? Have you ever felt like Sarah? If so, how did you handle it?
- How does Sarah change as a character over the course of her first year in college, and through the experiences she has throughout the novel?
